ST welcomed everyone to this year's AGM

Minutes from Previous AGM

ST confirmed that the Committee had signed these off.

Simon A said he had not seen them, and asked if this years minutes could be published on the IRARA website. It was agreed that this year's minutes would be published on the website and cascaded via mail chimp

Matters Arising from last years meeting

Membership benefits were explained in the newsletter

Location of defibrillator – this info was included in the last newsletter

Coffee morning – it was decided to organise a one off may not be very well attended. HS had investigated local ones, and details were put in the newsletter

Broadband event – this did not happen, as Open Ifra came and went very quickly before one could be arranged

Beheaded lamp post in Capel Rd – HS contacted the Civic Society, and their advice is best to leave for the time being, as we are not in a preservation area, so by highlighting this could mean it gets removed.

20mph and double red lines or traffic calming: We are on the waiting list for 20 mph CL will chase this up.

Simon A said he has been in touch with the schools with regards to coaches, all agreed this is better, albeit not perfect.

The committee looked into double red lines and the outcome was cascaded in the newsletter

"We have looked into the possibility of having red lines at the junction of Capel and Irvine Roads but having spoken with Cllr Lissimore to looked at what red lines would entail, we have decided not to proceed and will

continue to seek 20mph limits on all the streets. We felt that the red lines would have a disproportionate impact on the houses outside which they would be painted and, being actually quite short in length, would be unlikely to make a significant enough impact on either the parking or turning issues. "

Simon A suggested that we do a count of school children to support the 20mph speed limit. The committee agreed to contact Cllr Sue Lissimore to see if this was of use.

Street trees/ benches/ wildlife area – The committee will chase up councillors, and it was agreed that residents can decide to do some light tree maintenance at their own risk. Lack of response from councillors and officers has been disappointing

The committee also agreed to put a reminder in the newsletter, asking residents to cut back their own hedges and trees

3. Chair's Report -

ST reminded everyone that the two aims of IRARA are Neighbourhood improvement & community cohesion / wellbeing

ST reported on the Orchard and IRARA together – IRARA is the majority shareholder in the orchard and all of what happens in the orchard contributes to those two aims
